199. Work out: Solve the problem

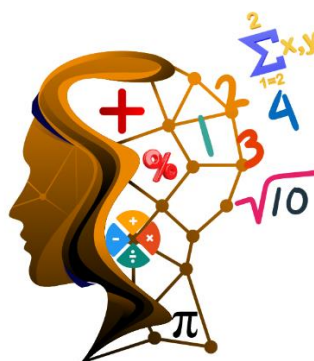
Use: He is very intelligent and can work out any difficult problem.

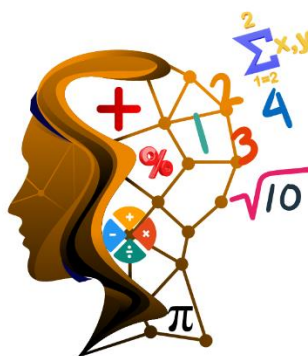

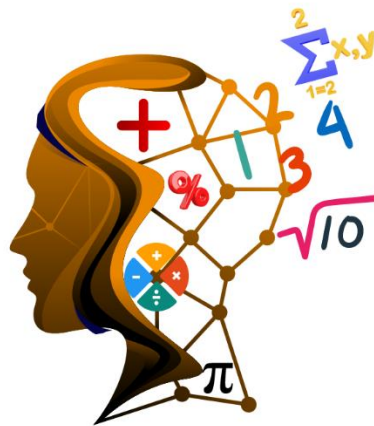

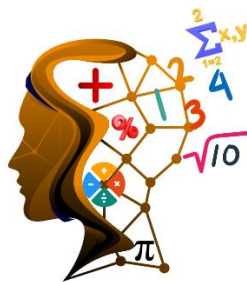
